Tiered approach to behaviour to support teaching and learning

<p>Stage 1</p>  <p>verbal reminder</p>	<p>This is a reminder of our expectations and should be enough to prompt you to follow the class ethos.</p>
<p>Stage 2</p>  <p>Visual reminder</p>	<p>You may be shown a timer or a card to remind you about behaviour expectations. Now is the time to really reflect upon your behaviour.</p>
<p>Stage 3</p>  <p>Thinking Time out</p>	<p>If the behaviour continues, you may be encouraged to have some time out- this could be in another classroom or in a safe space. You will then need to spend time reflecting on your behaviours with a member of staff. This may be at break or lunchtime. You may be asked to complete a reflection.</p>
<p>Stage 4</p>  <p>Other grown ups</p>	<p>If after having a period of reflection time, your behaviours continue, you will need to speak to Ms Redwood or another member of the leadership team.</p> <p>Depending on the incident, Ms Redwood or another senior member of staff will decide what to do next. This may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Meeting with your parents or carers • You having to work separately from your classmates for a period of time to keep people safe. • You not being able to have play and lunchtime breaks with everyone else • Finally, an external exclusion for a fixed period of time. This means that you can't come into school and must complete your learning at home.
<p><u>High level incidents</u></p>  <p>Parents</p>  <p>No School</p>	<p>You will be sent to Ms Redwood or another member of the leadership team straight away:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If you are swearing in school • If you are violent towards peers/adults • If your behaviour is unsafe for yourself or others • If you deliberately destroy school or other people's property • Racist incidents • Deliberately leaving the school site without permission <p>Depending on the incident, Ms Redwood or another senior member of staff will decide what to do next. This may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Meeting with your parents or carers • You having to work separately from your classmates for a period of time to keep people safe. • You not being able to have play and lunchtime breaks with everyone else • Finally, a suspension for a fixed period of time or an exclusion.
