Marina the mermaid is stuck on a rock! How can we rescue her?

We will be using our fab vocab and our phonics knowledge to make stories and begin to use connectives in our writing.

Where be the treasure?!

We will be creating treasure maps, using our new skills to find special objects. We will be collaborating to guide our friends to find the treasure, using directional language. We will also think about pirates and where the tales come from?

Hot or cold?

We will be comparing different climates and countries across the globe. Will we need a big warm coat, hat and scarf or a swimming costume, sunglasses and sun cream? Where might we find a polar bear or a camel?

Handwriting heroes!

We will continue to focus on letter formation, forming all of our letters correctly, including lower case and capital letters.

We will show them off in our super sentence writing, remembering a capital letter, finger spaces and full stop.

Water/sea or land/pollution/floating and sinking

We will plan and provide engaging learning experiences to encourage interest and a desire to learn more – we will then follow the children's interests and support them to discover more to deepen their knowledge and understanding.

Underwater Wanderers!

We will be looking at and comparing different sea animals, their different features, comparing their sizes and length and how we can protect them from pollution in our oceans.

Sounds of the sea!

We will be using our creativity to make sounds we may hear by the sea, a river or lake. We will explore different instruments to re-create sounds and create movement based on what we hear. We will also perform them to our friends.

Ahoy there!

We will be using different vessels to compare capacity of water stuck in our ship, weighing our pirate's treasure and recapping our number bond knowledge from 0-10.

The Sea, The Land, The Sky

We will be focussing on our fine motor skills, using scissors, drawing and painting. We will create our own piece of art, showing the landscape of the seaside. We will also use a variety of materials to make boats and see if they sink or float.
