Is your child interested in learning an instrument? We are delighted to share that our peripatetic music tutors all have spaces available in September! We have several specialist tutors who come in to school to teach guitar, drum, vocal and piano lessons. We are also excited to announce that Mrs Kerry Slade, our music teacher, will be offering 1:1 and small group lessons on the flute and recorder from September. All of our instrumental lessons take place during the school day.

Flute or recorder lessons

30 minute flute or recorder lesson 1:1 = £18 20 minute flute or recorder lesson 1:1 = £12 Group flute or recorder lessons = from £7

Vocal or piano lessons

30 minute vocal or piano lesson 1:1 = £20 20 minute vocal or piano lesson 1:1 = £12.50 Group vocal or piano lessons = from £7

Guitar or drum lessons


20 minute guitar or drum lesson 1:1 = £12 Group guitar or drum lessons = £9




Pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium will receive a 50% discount for the first term.



The infamous punishment book

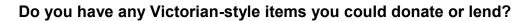


Newton Abbot Museum have also been researching the school's history, and now we're ready to take the next step!

Every little bit helps us bring this vision to life for the community and future generations.



- Try to keep a regular sleep routine where possible


