

Annex to Behaviour Policy:

Behaviour principles

In light of the need for children to behave differently when they return to school, and any new systems we have put in place to support this, we need to make changes to our behaviour policy.

Areas we wish to add to our behaviour policy are expectations that children and adults will:

- follow any altered routines for arrival or departure
- follow school instructions on hygiene, such as handwashing and sanitising
- follow instructions on who pupils can socialise with at school
- move around the school as per specific instructions (for example, one-way systems, out of bounds areas, queueing)
- follow expectations about sneezing, coughing, tissues and disposal ('catch it, bin it, kill it') and avoid touching their mouth, nose and eyes with hands
- tell an adult if they are experiencing symptoms of coronavirus
- follow rules about not sharing any equipment or other items including drinking bottles
- follow expectations about breaks or play times, including where children may or may not play
- follow rules around the use of toilets
- follow clear rules about not coughing or spitting at or towards any other person
- follow clear rules for pupils at home about conduct in relation to remote education
- adhere to rewards and sanction systems where appropriate

If children display more challenging behaviour, or refuse to follow the new instructions, Senior Leaders and parents will become involved in organising appropriate arrangements for their learning.
